August – Family History Month. There are so many conferences, workshops etc being advertised that we are spoiled for choice. And of course there is also our own display at Springwood Library.


Research Tips

Metropolitan Memorial Parks – this is a self-funding business that has been formed to manage Crown Lands that hold cemeteries within the Sydney urban area. The Search feature on the site covers all the cemeteries it manages. Cemeteries that are now under the banner of this business are: Eastern Suburbs Memorial Park, Field of Mars Cemetery, Frenchs Forest Bushland Cemetery, Gore Hill Memorial Cemetery, Macquarie Park Cemetery and Crematorium, Rookwood General Cemetery and Crematorium, Sandgate Cemetery, and Woronora Memorial Park.
