#### when trying to get through a brick wall

- 1. Re-examine everything-go back over all the research, you may have missed something
- 2. Explore all available sources-broaden your search area
- 3. Try name variations-account for mis-spelling, phonetic spellings, transcription errors
- 4. Expand age ranges-did they want to be older (joining the military) or younger (closer in age to a spouse)
- 5. Look for FANS-friends and neighbours
- 6. What was happening at the time-may provide context for why they moved or changed careers
- 7. Ask for help-relatives may know more than you know
- 8. Browse rather than search-incorrect indexing or mis-spelled names could be found
- 9. Create an online tree-will keep your research organised, and may lead to more information
- 10. Consider hiring a professional
- 11. Take a DNA test-the results may point you in a new direction
- 12. Keep Learning-new techniques, new resources, new ideas
- 13. Never give up-if completely stuck, leave it for a while and comeback to it later with 'new'eyes.
