Issue 1.

Our auditor has suggested that we stop creating paper copies of 'The Explorers' Tree' in order to remove the most expensive cost in our annual budget. He has recommended that we send a digital copy to our members.

We currently purchase the smallest bulk order of 125 copies, which gives us too many, but there would be no saving if we purchased the exact number of copies required.

This year we paid \$1155 for printing + \$488 for postage. The local postage is covered by the postage fee charged to members, but international postage is not covered and totals approximately \$130 a year. This will possibly increase next year. One solution to this might be to bulk post once a year to international destinations.

Another consideration is that the international and local libraries need paper copies. It would be possible to print off a few copies at Office Works to cater for this which would dramatically reduce our costs. However, the Society is required to send digital copies of the magazine to the State and Australian repositories. This is an extra workload for Ian.

A decision regarding this issue will need to be made at the AGM.

Issue 2

Several members have suggested that we have a few training sessions at our meetings. The ideas seem to be about "How do I" topics or perhaps sharing research skills. If you have some ideas about this please share them at our AGM so the Committee can begin planning for them.

Issue 3

Should we increase our fees to cover the ever-increasing costs of hall hire, insurance and compulsory memberships?

Trade table - Our trade table will be operating again this month, so you can donate any unwanted good quality items to the table display. If something from the table catches your fancy, please drop some cash in the Society's moneybox for the item, then take it. Remember that if your donated items don't sell, you will need to take them home again.
